Finding the FedRooms Rate through your designated travel agency

Travel management companies (also known as travel agencies) servicing government agencies have access to FedRooms properties and rates. To ensure that you receive the FedRooms Rate, be sure to ask for it by name. First request a FedRooms property, and then request the FedRooms Rate.

By insisting on the FedRooms Rate, you are entitled to program-specific benefits, including:

- Cancellation policy of 4pm (or later) day of arrival
- No fees for early check-out
- Rates that are at or below federal government per diem

Remember—no matter how you book, insist on the FedRooms Rate by name, and accept no substitutes.

 U.S. General Services Administration

- FedRooms is the official government-wide lodging program contracted through the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA).
- There are currently 4,500 hotels in the FedRooms program, spanning cities around the world.
- 60% of participating FedRooms properties extend the FedRooms rate to federal travelers on leisure travel, small groups and meetings of up to 25 people, as well as state government employees and government contractors on official business. These rates are available through the advanced search function on fedrooms.com.
